THE INHERITANCE OF THE SONS

INTRODUCTION: God the Father wants to give a spiritual inheritance to His sons (and daughters) through spiritual fathers (and mothers), 2 Cor.12:4. Yet our preparations influence our inheritance and it's end result.

- 1. FATHERS CAN GIVE THEIR NATURAL & SPIRITUAL CHILDREN A SPIRITUAL INHERITANCE In the Old Testament, an inheritance (natural & spiritual) was passed down through the forefathers. In the New Testament, a spiritual inheritance is imparted from our spiritual fathers & mothers, 1 Cor.15:46 A. Anointings or mantles, Deut.34:9, 2 Kings 2:9-10 & 13-15.
 - B. Prophecies to guide us, 1 Tim.1:18, Jud.4:6-7, 5:7-8.
 - C. Spiritual gifts, 2 Tim.1:6, Rom.1:11.
 - D. Leadership positions, Tit.1:4-5, 1 Tim.1:2-3, 2 Kings 2:15-16.

2. ACCORDING TO OUR PREPARATIONS WE WILL EACH RECEIVE A DIFFERENT INHERITANCE.

- A. The spiritual sons of the prophet Elijah:
 - 1) Elijah's 1st servant, 1 Kings 18:38-43. He was faithful in revival... but he disappeared during trouble, I Kings 19:1-4. He was never heard from again! No ministry, no eternal reward, not even named in the Bible. He didn't lose his salvation, but he lost out on a great inheritance.
 - 2) The sons of the prophets that studied under Elijah, 2 Kgs.2:2-7. They gained revelation and followed Elijah (1/2 heartedly), they were sons who received some of his prophetic ministry.
 - 3) Elisha: He was fully faithful in following Elijah to the end, 2 Kgs.2:8-9. He wanted the double portion reserved for the eldest son's inheritance, Deut.21:17. In 2 Kgs.2:11-15, Elijah gained the full mantle and inheritance, & became the next national prophet & spiritual father in Elijah's place, 2 Kgs.13:14.
- B. The firstborn blessing of Jacob:
 - 1) Reuben was the firstborn who should have received a double portion and leadership over his brethren. However, he was disqualified because of his immorality, Gen.49:3-4, Gen.35:22.
 - 2) The double portion was given to Joseph, Gen.49:26 & 1 Chron.5:2.
 - 3) The position of leadership was given to Judah, Gen.49:10 & 1 Chron.5:2.

3. THE RESULT OF OUR INHERITANCE WILL ALSO BE INFLUENCED BY OUR ACTIONS A. The Prodigal Son:

- 1) Luke 15:11-12 He was blessed with an inheritance, but he demanded it before he was ready, Prov.20:21.
- 2) Luke 15: 13 While enjoying his inheritance, he left his father and fell into sin
- 3) Luke 15: 17-21 The son repented and returned
 - a) At first the Prodigal had requested, "give me," v.12
 - b) The Prodigal later asked, "make me," v.19
 - c) Character must come before ministry, Gen.1:26
- 4) Luke 15:22 The restored son received:
 - a) a robe (of righteousness, Is. 61:10)
 - b) a ring (of authority, Gen. 41:42)
 - c) sandals (a ministry, Eph. 6:15)
- d) Luke 15:31 But the prodigal had lost his inheritance! The blessing became a curse! B. Levi:
 - 1) Gen. 49: 5-7 Levi's father cursed him for his sin.
 - 2) Gen.34:25 Levi at first used his sword in self-righteous anger, Deut. 34:25
 - 3) Ex. 32: 25-29 the Levites later used their sword for the righteous anger of God
 - 4) Deut.33:8-11 Moses blessed the tribe of Levi for their obedience

- 5) Neh. 13:2 God turned the curse into a blessing, Deut. 23:5
 - a) Levi was given no natural inheritance, the Lord became his inheritance, Deut. 10: 8-9
 - b) Levi was scattered (the curse of Gen. 49:7), but this was turned into a blessing:
 - c) Levi was scattered to teach, to lead, to minister, Deut. 33:10

C. The Daughters of Zelophehad

- 1) Num. 27:1-8 Women are often given a spiritual inheritance (gifts, ministries, anointings, etc.)
- 2) Num.36:1-9 To keep their spiritual inheritance a woman must marry someone from the same 'tribe,' someone with the same calling, or they may lose their inheritance, 2 Cor.6:14!
