Growth

The world offers many counterfeits.

Things that <u>distract</u> us from the real meaning of life.

In Psalm 16:11 says:

"Thou wilt show me the path of life: in thy presence is <u>fulness of joy</u>; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore." Psalms 16:11

In Psalm 43:4 it declares: "God is my exceeding joy:" Christ himself should be our joy and expectation.

Remember, God wants very close and dear friends.

In these last days, the love of many will turn cold - Matthew 24:12 Why? Because iniquity and worldliness shall abound.

This is a warning to <u>Christians</u>. Unbelievers do not have the love of God. The love of many will turn cold. Because there is no deep commitment. The love for God is very shallow.

Consider a young woman named Orpah in the book of Ruth 1:14-15

Orpah kissed her mother in law goodbye; but Ruth clave unto her. And Naomi said, Behold, thy sister in law is gone back unto her people, and unto her gods" Ruth 1:14, 15, KJV.

What is the problem? No depth of commitment.

There are many Christians today like this.

There is a shallow superficial love for God, but no real depth.

When trouble comes in these times, many Christians will turn from God.

The love of many will turn cold. Again, Matthew 24:12.

We call these - Fairweather friends

Fair weather friends

In America we have an expression that describes shallow relationships. Relationships that are <u>not very deep.</u> We call them <u>fair weather friends</u>. What is a fair weather friend?

Someone is your friend, when things are going well: ... advantages. But when difficulties arise, they turn away from you.

Unfortunately, there are many fair weather friends of Jesus. In John 6:54-66, we see that many disciples of Jesus turned back. They were offended over some of the things Jesus taught.

John 6:60-61 "Many therefore of his <u>disciples</u>, when they had heard this, said, This is an hard saying; who can hear it? When Jesus knew in himself that his disciples murmured at it, he said, Doth this <u>offend</u> you?"

Many followed Jesus because of the great miracles he performed. But when he asked for commitment, - many turned back. John 6:66 - from that time many of his disciples turned back, and walked with Jesus no more.

John 2:23 "many believed in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did." John 6:2 "And a great multitude followed him, because they saw his miracles which he did on them that were diseased."

Are we following God only for great spectacular miracles, or provision? We will be tested to see if we really love God with all our heart.

Sadly, when the tests come, Many Christians turn back.

Because their commitment and Love for God is very shallow.

What is the purpose for the coming antichrist. To test our commitment.

Jesus warns us - The love of many will turn cold. Matthew 24:12.

Born to be tested

During this short life on earth, we are here to be tested. This is often not understood by many people, even Christians. But this is made very clear in Job 7:17-18

"What is man, that thou shouldest magnify him? and that thou shouldest set thine heart upon him? And that thou shouldest visit him every morning, and try him every moment?"

God wants a tested people, who Love him with all their heart.

Who are not following him for spectacular miracles, wonders, provision..

But because they love him, and they want His full approval.

They want to be very close to him for all eternity.

Remember, to have Christ is to have everything.

Christ is the source of life. He and his father created everything.

In John 1:3 it says: All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. John 1:10* He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.

Remember, this world is temporary. It is going to pass away.

This short life will soon be over.

But he who does the will of God abides forever. 1 John 2:17

So let's invest in our relationship with our wonderful creator.

The One main thing God wants from this creation, is close friends.

Let's be one of those close friends of God, like Abraham.

In Lamentations 3:24 - "The LORD is my portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in him." He Is my reward, my inheritance, my everything. Joy.

Psalms 18:1-3, "I will love thee, O LORD, <u>my strength</u>. The LORD is <u>my rock</u>, and <u>my fortress</u>, and <u>my deliverer</u>; <u>my God, my strength</u>, in whom I will trust; <u>my buckler</u>, and the horn of <u>my salvation</u>, and <u>my high tower</u>. I will call upon the LORD, who is worthy to be praised: so shall I be saved from mine enemies."

"But thou, O LORD, art <u>a shield</u> for me; <u>my glory</u>, and the lifter up of mine <u>head."</u> Psalms 3:3, KJV. Lord, You are my encourager, my protector.

Obedience -the key to growth

"But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God perfected:."

1 John 2:5. We will continue to grow old in our relationship with God,

As we obey him, and listening to what he's saying to our heart.

1 Peter 1:22 tells us "our souls are purified by obeying the truth through the Spirit ... leading us unto unfeigned love of the brethren..."

The outstanding difference between A committed / uncommitted Christian:

<u>A committed Christian</u> - involves God in everything, plans, motives. Lord, what would you desire in this situation? How can I please you?

An uncommitted Christian - leaves God out of his plans.

He does not want God to upset his desires. And ...

Does not really believe that God is really interested in his happiness.

Yet, what God chooses is what leads do unspeakable joy / happiness
