1. What does the word “genesis” actually mean and how does this describe the book of Genesis?
2. Briefly discuss the error and delusion of atheism and evolution. Prove from Scripture that the theory of evolution is false.
3. Briefly summarize the “Gap Theory.”
4. Explain the spiritual significance of the Sabbath day.
5. Explain the difference between holiness and innocence.
6. Discuss the divine institution of marriage. What is marriage a type of?
7. Discuss the significance of Genesis 3:15, which is the first mention of Satan’s judgment, and the first promise of the Messiah in the Bible.
8. Discuss the distinction that must be made between The Fall and the Curse. How were the judgments an act of God’s mercy?
9. Discuss the reasons why God drove Adam and Eve out of the Garden.
10. Discuss the offerings of Cain and Abel. Why did God receive Abel’s offering and not Cain’s offering?
11. Discuss the three groups of believers in Noah’s day and how they correlate to the three groups of believers in the last days described in Revelation 12.
12. Explain how the threefold command to Noah to be fruitful, multiply, and replenish the earth, applies to us as believers today as well.
13. Discuss the covenant God made with Noah after the flood and the token of the covenant, the rainbow, and its significance.
14. Discuss the importance of the life of Abraham to Christians.

15. Discuss the spiritual significance of Melchizedek as a king and priest.
16. Discuss the birth of Ishmael and how this was an act of presumption on the part of Abraham and Sarah. What does the offspring of Hagar represent?
17. Discuss the Esau's sale of his birthright to Jacob (Genesis 25:29-34).
18. Discuss the major event, the "Peniel Experience," in the life of Jacob where his name was changed to Israel (Genesis 32:24-32).
19. Discuss the significance of Joseph's dreams as a child and their fulfillment in his deliverance of Israel as a man.
20. Describe one major event from the life of Joseph that speaks to you personally.
